



What will you do?

This is in addition to the general Trustee role description

- take an interest and gain understanding about what staff and volunteers are doing around improving our Welsh language offer, and how these fits in with national Citizens Advice aims
- keep up to date by signing up to relevant newsletters
- help other trustees understand the importance of the Welsh language scheme
- help trustees understand the membership requirements in relation to Welsh Language activity
- enable staff and volunteers to give presentations or updates to the trustee board regularly
- provide or arrange for a full report on Welsh Language to be presented to the trustee board at least annually
- together with the Chief Officer and Chair of trustees, represent the local Citizens Advice in relationships with key stakeholders, for example, local councillors



What's in it for you?

What do you need to have?

You don't need any specific qualifications or skills but you'll need to have an interest in Welsh language work as well as the [personal skills and qualities](#) for trustees in general. Skills in speaking, reading, and writing in the Welsh language would be an advantage.



How much time do you need to give?

Trustee boards usually meet in the evenings and you'll likely need to give **8+** number of hours on average per month and you may need to attend and/or lead meetings, with volunteers and staff occasionally within the local Citizens Advice. We can be flexible about the time spent and how often you volunteer so come and talk to us.



Valuing inclusion

Our volunteers come from a range of backgrounds and we particularly welcome applications from disabled people, people with physical or mental health conditions, LGBT+ and non-binary people, and people from Black Asian Minority Ethnic (BAME) communities.
